#### Rapid SOS Interface

Dispatch now has the Rapid SOS Interface through Central Square installed on our CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch) system. RapidSOS is another data sharing tool designed to help the dispatcher find the location of the caller. This technology could potentially speed up the response to an incident.

The dispatcher can click on the "Update Address" button shown below. They will then look in the source Column for RapidSOS. This is the RapidSOS location and the dispatcher can highlight the entry and click **Accept**. It's that simple!

Brian Holtel - 1185951 - CC 52: Alarm - This caller, from an alarm company, needed dispatch on a commercial fire alarm at a nursing facility. Brian did a great job with this case! The caller volunteered the 'area' of the alarm activation. Brian then made sure in Key Questions, when he was verifying this information, to use an appropriate clarifying question. This literally made my day!

Kimberly Jent - 1209131 - CC 77: Motor Vehicle Collision - This was a Jeep rollover with ejection. Kimberly did a great job with this case. Kimberly stayed on task and was able to gather all needed information with no deviations. She also answered several questions on her own when in the protocol.

Lyndsey Stump - 1219630 - CC 10: Chest Pains - This caller was complaining of chest pain. Lindsey displayed great customer service with this caller by speaking louder and repeating questions as he said he was hard of hearing. Lindsey also did an excellent job with the aspirin diagnostic tool and then remaining on the line with this caller to monitor his status until help arrived.





#### **Citizen Interaction Software Brings Amazing Stats**

On March 7, 2022 The Communication's Center went live with new software allowing callers to receive updates about their incident while it is active. For 911 hang-up calls and 911 silent calls at Kings Island this season, a caller receives a text message confirming their location, letting them know a unit is responding and provides a number they can call if they have additional information. Seeing this text message and realizing their phone accidentally dialed 911 while on a roller coaster has significantly decreased calls for service at Kings Island. Below are stats from both seasons.

Last year between January 1- August 31, dispatch created a total of 10,448 calls at Kings Island, **9600** of those were 911 hang up or 911 silent calls. This year we created 4,417 calls and **3,488** of those were 911 hang up or 911 silent calls.

# K-105 Public Information Basics Hosted by: Warren County Emergency Management Agency September 19-21, 2022

<u>Course Description</u>: To equip participants with the skills needed to be full or part-time PIOs, including oral and written communications; understanding and working with the media; and basic tools and techniques to perform effectively as a PIO, both in the proactive/advocacy times and crisis/emergency response.

The learner must achieve a minimum passing score of 75% on final knowledge assessments or demonstrate mastery on performance assessments or research assignments to earn the IACET CEU

L-105 is a "Required" Pre-requisite for the E/L 388 Advanced PIO Course
